According to Corder errors are significant of three things, first to the teacher, analysis that they tell him, if he or she undertakes a systematic analysis, how far towards that goal the learner has progressed and, consequently, what remains for him to learn.

3 Error Analysis (henceforth EA) emerged in the 1960s by S.Pit Corder and his colleagues as a reaction to the view that language transfer is the central process involved in FL/ L2 language learning, despite the fact that EA is somehow earlier as stated by Ellis (1994:48). It showed that Contrastive Analysis (henceforth CA) was unable to predict a great majority of errors.

Error analysis (EA) was an alternative to contrastive analysis, an approach influenced by behaviorism through which applied linguists sought to use the formal distinctions between the learners' first and second languages to predict errors.
