Empirical evidence suggests that unconscious phenomena include repressed feelings, automatic skills, subliminal perceptions, and automatic reactions, and possibly also complexes, hidden phobias and desires. The concept was popularized by the Austrian neurologist and psychoanalyst Sigmund Freud.

Freud and the Unconscious Mind

Some unconscious processes flow from our personal experiences, but others stem from our ancestors' experiences with universal themes. Jung divided the unconscious into the personal unconscious, which contains the complexes (emotionally toned groups of related ideas) and the collective unconscious, which includes various archetypes.

That is, values clarification can help a therapist better understand what a patient wants out of therapy (and life in general), but it can also do the same for a patient themselves if their values were unconscious. Since value systems can be unconscious, values clarification can be helpful both in and out of a therapy setting.
